A MESSAGE FROM YOUR MP

Dear resident of Fundy Royal,

I hope that you and your loved ones are having a good summer and enjoying all that New Brunswick has to offer.

Since the pandemic began last year, my office has heard from thousands of residents looking for support on navigating government programs. As we gathered feedback, I contacted colleagues both in opposition and in the government to advocate for changes. It was important to me that the programs were established to fit the needs of all New Brunswickers, including those who live in rural or suburban communities.

I wanted to give you an update on what was happening in Parliament over the past couple of months. I've been disappointed by the legislation prioritized by the Liberal Government, as it is out of touch with the priorities here in New Brunswick.

The primary focus of the Liberal Government was bill C-10, a piece of legislation that has significant ramifications for free speech on the internet leaving the door open for a massive abuse of power on the rights of Canadians. Despite their best efforts to shut-down debate, the Liberals were unable to pass the bill through the Senate before the summer. I oppose C-10 becoming law, and I expect it to receive the scrutiny it deserves in the Senate assuming Parliament continues this Fall.

Other legislation that the Government is pushing includes bill C-22 which eliminates mandatory prison time for a number of violent offences. As the

Conservative Shadow Minister for Justice and Attorney General of Canada, I have been raising my opposition to the Liberals eliminating mandatory prison time for crimes that include drive-by shootings and robbery with a firearm. C-22 also expands house arrest for a number of violent offences including sexual assault and kidnapping.

The Government of Canada should be focused on supporting victims, not on helping violent criminals. As the Vice Chair of the Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights, I pushed for the committee to review the Canadian Victims Bill of Rights so that better supports can be provided to victims. Under the law, as passed by the former Conservative Government in 2015, a mandatory review was to take place last year. Unfortunately, the Liberals refuse to start it.

As your Member of Parliament, I will continue to stand up for the residents of Fundy Royal in Ottawa.

This summer, more than ever, many small businesses in our communities are still hurting. Please support local.

I wish you and your family a very happy summer.

To keep you updated on what is happening in Parliament, see the "Votes by Rob" update below which highlights some of the motions and bills Rob has voted on recently as the Member of Parliament for Fundy Royal.

Motion advocating for \$110 increase to Old Age Security

Rob voted in support of a motion before the House of Commons calling on the government to include a \$110-per-month boost to Old Age Security for all seniors 65 and older.

Nearly all Liberal MPs voted against this motion.

Help Canadians to better protect their homes.

Conservative bill C-234 would make home security more affordable by introducing the Home Security Tax Credit. The bill would establish a tax credit for up to \$5,000 per year for the installation, maintenance, and monitoring of a security system to monitor structures such as a home, garage, and barn. Rob voted in support of the bill at second reading.

All Liberal MPs voted against this bill.

Ban the dumping of raw sewage in Canadian waters

Conservative bill C-269 would ban the dumping of raw sewage in fish-bearing waters across Canada. Rob voted in support of the bill at second reading.

All Liberal MPs voted against this bill.

Support our farmers by exempting farming fuel from the carbon tax

Rob voted to support bill C-206 that would add propane and natural gas to the list of farm fuels exempt from the federal carbon tax.

Nearly all Liberal MPs voted against this motion.

A national framework for diabetes

Rob voted in support of bill C-237 to establish a national diabetes strategy in response to a number of constituents who reached out to his office raising concerns about the lack of supports available.

Members of Parliament from all parties unanimously supported this bill.

Protecting supply management for our farmers

Rob voted in support of Bill C-216, a bill that would protect Canada's supply-managed agricultural sector when negotiating any new trade deals with other countries. Now more than ever, Rob believes we must protect Canada's farmers.

Nearly all Liberal MPs voted against this motion.


